Please write your prayer request on the paper slips provided and place in the box provided if it's a private prayer and on the ribbon board if you'd like others to see and join in with your prayer. Include the name of the person you want to be prayed for and, if you wish, the reason – but single-word prayer, whether it's someone's name or something that's happened, is fine.

Prayers in the box will only be known to the clergy during our services and kept within the parish Prayer Group on Wednesdays.

All names and prayers will be entered in our Prayer Book which will rest on the altar during our Parish Services.

THE BOOK

Your prayer or prayer request will be transcribed into our Parish Prayer Book which will be placed on the altar during our Parish services. Those named in it will be remembered before God by the clergy at all services and daily offices and by the Parish Prayer group when they meet.

From time to time individual long term/ongoing prayer needs will be remembered by name on our weekly pew sheets and during our services
